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CHAIRMAN RAGUSA: Let me -- maybe we're not so far apart here. Are you asking for the design consultant to actually design potential uses or upgrades or rehabs to certain assets?

MR. ROSS: No. What -- thank you. That's a good question. No. What I'm envisioning is, they're going to come back and say, "It turns out you've got 47 parks or green spaces in Westchase. These are our recommended uses or plans," or "This is what you should be doing.'

Then we may say, "Okay. Well, we're ready to tackle the two main parks because that's of the highest priority, and we kind of see what your vision or plan of it is. You've given us generally what you ballpark the dollar figure to tackle these things," and then we begin to sharpen that, just like any other project we do, and at some point we may vote to move forward with that or we may vote not to.

Does that better answer your question?

MR. CHESNEY: Yeah. I mean, I think -CHAIRMAN RAGUSA: Yes. We're actually
in agreement.

But I don't think it is a huge effort for them to take a look at all of your parks in your entire community and say, "We need to do pedestrian friendly. We need to do landscaping. We need to do, you know, a splash pad somewhere else."

You know, there's some general stuff for very little money they can just throw out to you and say, "This is overall what the trend is. This is what you can expect in five years, ten years," whatever, give you some ideas, and then shift gears and refocus on the two large parks. Okay?

You're probably looking at between -- I think between fifteen and twenty thousand dollars' worth of services from us to do this. I think --

CHAIRMAN RAGUSA: To do what? MS. STEWART: To do just a generic master plan of some sort with just some generic ideas and focusing on these two parks.

I don't think that when you start getting into the nitty gritty to make decisions about all the other parks, I think

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MR. CHESNEY: -- yeah, and I think that goes along with what I was thinking. You're right. I mean, the spray pad is -- should we keep the band shell? You know, those general recommendations, should we scrap the spray pad? Should we enhance it?

I mean, I guess I wasn't really thinking of a complete design as much as, you know, what should we do with this thing.

CHAIRMAN RAGUSA: Tonja, do you understand what is being said? I want your input on this.

MR. CHESNEY: I don't think -- I don't think we're that far off.

MS. STEWART: Yeah. I mean, I have been listening to you all talk about this for a long time, so I've been trying to figure out -- you know, obviously your facilities are 20 years old. It needs some revamping.

I think it's important that this be evaluated from an overall perspective. Okay? Your two large parks are your highest priorities because they are currently not ADA compliant. Okay?

I think they just need to be told that.

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you're going to say, "We'll do that next year. Let's just get some general ideas of what the uses of these lands need to be to update our community."

I know at one point I heard somebody say something about upgrading some of the restroom facilities. I think that was thrown out at some point in time. So I think once they get out here, they do an inspection, they take a look at -- I think you're going to see them come up with some good ideas, but they're going to be cost prohibitive. I mean, we just need to understand that up front.

So you're probably looking at a fiveyear plan. So they'll do X first, X second, stop, wait until next year, come back, you'll start prioritizing which one of your green spaces you want to concentrate on, and then they'll come back the next year. I think this is going to be a long-term service.

MR. MAYS: And it's happened twice that we know of, but one child didn't get hurt. It just fell on him, and the man was concerned about his child's safety at that point, too. So we didn't do anything about it other than tighten it up, make sure the bolts were good and tight, you know, see if they were secure.

But it just seems like every time we try to anchor them down, the anchors disappear; and then when they disappear, it make them unstable again. For safety reasons, we removed them.

MS. WHYTE: And the county is very strict right now on safety for children, because I believe there have been nine deaths attributed to soccer injuries, and that's one of the reasons that this county has been very, very stringent about all of the parks, not just here, all of the county parks.

MR. SALAZAR: Okay. I have Roger beside me. He's a soccer trainer. Maybe he

MR. BENITEZ: My name is Roger Benitez. I'm actually a soccer coach at FC Tampa, Town & Country complex, and I've actually been -- I got invited to come and play with these guy about ten years ago when I moved to Tampa.

I'm not a Westchase resident, but most of these guys are. And we've been playing there for over ten years. We never had an any kind of an accident, incident or any problems with the neighborhood.

I think the problems that you're probably referring to is being there so early. We adjusted that. We used to start playing at 7:00 in the morning. We moved that to 8:00, you know, considering that we were getting there -- you know, probably disturbing the neighborhood not in a bad way.

One of the possibilities that we came up with is, paying for -- you know, providing our own goals, because we used to be able to use the Westchase goals that are locked up and chained on the field right now, but they don't give us the combinations on those goals anymore because liability issues and that sort of thing.

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comes with some ideas how we can fix this. I think if we -- we want to be -- we work with the community. If it's too early to start the game, maybe we can start later, so -- it's Sunday morning. I understand that, too. People want to sleep a little bit later.

So we can play maybe by 9:00. And, you know, fix the soccer -- the goals or something -- we really want to use the park as a soccer field. So if we work together and we find a solution, because I've been playing for maybe one year right there, and all my playmates say, "Adolfo, we've been playing a decade, ten years." They've been playing ten years, and now we have this problem.

And I think the community is growing up with people that love to play soccer, and if we have no goals, you know, it's frustrating.

CHAIRMAN RAGUSA: But do you understand why we removed them?

MR. SALAZAR: Yeah, I understand, and I'm telling you we can work together and fix -- we come with new ideas. I can send you an email. I have this idea to the goals, we can use it and remove it, you know, something --

MR. BENITEZ: So one of the solutions that we came up with is providing our own goals, we lock them up, we put them away. That way, only we can use them. And if it's necessary, we'll sign a waiver so that way you're free, the community, the county or --from any liabilities.

The other solution proposal, as we do in the Town & Country soccer complex, we do use sand bags. We put sand bags on the goals. And they need to be about between 75 and 100 pounds each. We will provide them, we will put them on the goals, and we put the goals away way every time we use them. That way, they don't tilt and fall or create an accident.

That's one of the solutions that we actually came out with at the park, and the county actually owns that park, and they approved that. They also come around and make sure that they do. We use them currently every day. All I'm talking about is Sunday mornings, a couple hours we use them and put them back.
